### ◆ BAPTISM ◆

Parents are expected to be registered and practicing Catholics witnessing to their faith by regular attendance at Mass. Parents should contact the rectory at least three months prior to the desired date of Baptism, in order to allow sufficient time for the sacramental preparation.

### ◆ FIRST EUCHARIST/RECONCILIATION ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class *one year prior* to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Second Grade.

### ◆ CONFIRMATION ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class *one year prior* to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Eighth Grade.

### ◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Engaged couples are to contact the rectory at least six months before the desired date in order to prepare properly for the celebration of the sacrament.

### ◆ CHILD FAITH FORMATION ◆

**ALL ARE SENT**  
 Fifty days after Easter Sunday we celebrate the fulfillment of all God's promises in the feast of Pentecost, a feast that has sometimes been called the birthday of the Church. One last time we are reminded that we Christians have received the Holy Spirit, not for our own benefit, but to enable us to follow our Christian vocation. The centerpiece of the scriptures for Pentecost is the account in Acts of the Apostles of the sending of the Holy Spirit to the disciples. The other readings for this Sunday help us to understand what it means to live out our Christian vocation. Paul's letter show us the gifts and fruits that the Holy Spirit gives to us. John's Gospel reminds us that Jesus has sent all his disciples to share his forgiveness and peace, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

**LITURGICAL MINISTRY FORMATION**

ARE YOU Being CALLED TO BRING THE EUCHARIST TO THE SICK AND HOMEBOUND?  
ARE YOU CONSIDERING BECOMING AN EXTRAORDINARY MINISTER OF THE EUCHARIST?  
WOULD YOU LIKE TO BECOME A LECTOR?

The Office of Worship offers six hour formation session for new Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion and for new Lectors. These formation days are designed to give fundamental information. Participants will be expected to continue their formation by learning the liturgical practices particular to their parish, being publicly commissioned before the parish assembly and deepening their faith through private and liturgical prayer. In the introductory two hours, new ministers are introduced to sacramental theology, particularly that of the Eucharist. Next, our presenters offer technical and spiritual direction for the minister's specific liturgical role. Finally, new lectors conclude with two hours of coaching in proclamation and oral interpretation. Extraordinary ministers have the option to prepare for bringing the Eucharist to the sick and homebound. Please consider "brushing up" by participating in this workshop if you have been a Lector or an Extraordinary Minister for some time. The programs are held at St. Hilary Church, 761 Hilary Dr., Tiburon, and are on the following days:

**New Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion Training:** June 13th 9:30 a.m.—3:30 p.m.

**New Lector Training: Session I:** June 13th 9:30 a.m.—3:30 p.m.

**Session II:** June 20th 2:30 p.m.—4:30 p.m.

**Training for Communion to the Sick and Homebound (optional):** June 20th 2:30 p.m.—4:30 p.m.
