◆ BAPTISM ◆

Parents are expected to be registered and practicing Catholics witnessing to their faith by regular attendance at Mass. Parents should contact the rectory at least three months prior to the desired date of Baptism, in order to allow sufficient time for the sacramental preparation.

◆ FIRST EUCHARIST/RECONCILIATION ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class *one year prior* to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Second Grade.

◆ CONFIRMATION ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class *one year prior* to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Eighth Grade.

◆ CHILD FAITH FORMATION ◆

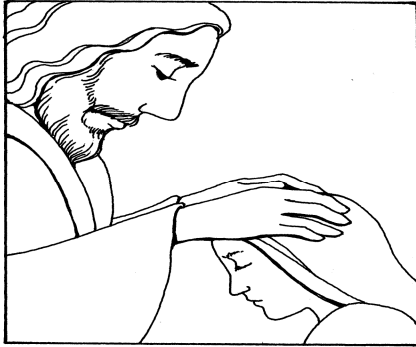

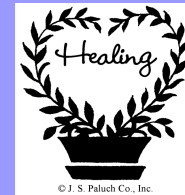

OBSTACLES

The prophet Ezekiel, Saint Paul, and the Lord Jesus share something in common in today's scripture readings: they all experience obstacles to their ministry. Ezekiel is summoned to prophesy to the Israelites, who are "hard of face and obstinate of heart" (Ezekiel 2:4). Saint Paul recounts how he has been given a "thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12:7). The Lord Jesus is unable to perform many signs in his native place. The Gospel tells us that "he was amazed at their lack of faith" (Mark 6:6). We, too, sometimes encounter obstacles as we travel along the journey of faith. So often we experience weakness on this journey. Let the words of the Lord to Saint Paul encourage us today: "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9).

Why are Catholics so silent on important issues and thus uninformed? The reason for this tragic tradition is the lack of fellowship when gathering for worship. Before and/or after Mass the Church should be filled with voices exchanging ideas. Do you suppose that the early Christians were silent when gathering? You can pray in silence, or vocally, almost anytime at one place or another and you should pray throughout the day, but because some Catholics only view silence as a show of reverence, when reverence is shown in many ways, especially with the gift of speech/communication being among these, everyone in Church is subjected to an intimidating false respect. So fellowship is out and quiet is in, and there is no exchange of ideas. Why are you Catholics so silent on important issues thus uninformed? Well you cannot deny that this lack of fellowship is a major cause; in-house suppression! God wants to hear from us, and contrary to the notion that God is deaf expressed by the following recitation: "Lord, hear our prayers," He is always listening, so speak, we are God's family gathering on "Sondays" to unite for worship and fellowship. Amen.
