Please contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

Wisdom 1:13-15; 2:23-24; Psalm: 30;
2 Corinthians 8:7, 9, 13-15; Mark 5:21-43

THE LORD OF LIFE

At this bountiful time of year, our Sunday readings teem with life and abundance. Both the first reading, from the book of Wisdom, and the Gospel passage from Mark assure us that God did not make death or even will us to be ill. Illness and death entered the world through the presence of evil, the Wisdom author tells us. Mark's stories of Jesus healing a hemorrhaging woman and resuscitating a dead little girl make it clear that Jesus is from God. As the Son of God he does not will that anyone suffer illness or death. In the face of such power, the second reading, from Paul's Second Letter to the Corinthians, provides a stark contrast. Jesus, who could raise the dead to new life, "though he was rich, for your sake he became poor" (2 Corinthians 8:9). Our gift of new life from Christ demands our response in charity.

CHILD FAITH FORMATION YEAR IN REVIEW:



- We welcomed 17 new families into our program for school year 2014-15.
- 120 students enrolled; 78% were returning students, 22% were new students
- Mrs. Julie Cunanan and Ms. Violy Carnero received their California Basic Certification in Catechesis
- Saints (disguised as Confirmation students) visited our classrooms close to All Saints Day to share the history their lives with the younger children.
- Church time was spent with learning about the parts of the Mass and the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
- For the first time, many of our CFF families participated in the lighting of the Advent wreath candles each Sunday of Advent and we learned about St. Nicholas during our Advent/Christmas celebration.
- CFF families hosted the Tuesday before Lent began an evening event on creating a prayer space in our homes to help us prayerfully journey thru the Lenten season.
- The First Communion and Confirmation 2 families went on retreat.
- The Confirmation students spent time with other young people in San Mateo county during XLT hosted by St. Denis Church and our sisters and brothers who gather at the Cathedral for the Handicapables Mass and lunch.
- We had 22 students who received their First Holy Communion.
- On Pentecost Sunday, our 16 confirmation students received the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- We ended the school year with "The Living Rosary" focusing on missionary church of the whole world.

What's happening now...many of our students are finished with school and on summer vacation. Relatives and friends from near and far are visiting. Many are making plans to enjoy the summer sunny days. These days are exciting and memorable times. It is also a time to re-examine our own attitude towards our faith and the formation of our children in our Catholic Christian faith. Questions of the Week:

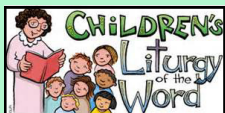
Imagine the grief of the father of the little girl who is dying. He comes to Jesus for help; but before he can reach her, people come to say that she has died. Then Jesus goes to the house of Jairus. Jesus takes the girl's hand and says, "Little girl, I say to you, arise!" Immediately she stands up and begins to walk around. They were all astounded. Like the crowd, we may be inclined not to accept the word of Jesus at times. We may think we know better. But Jesus will still remind us of the need to trust him and to have no fear.

Let us imagine that Jesus asks us, as he asked the disciples, "Why are you lacking in faith?"

How will we answer? What is Jesus trying to show us in this event?

Children's Liturgy of the Word

Every first and third Sunday of the month during the 10:00am Mass, children in grades K to 5 are invited after the opening prayer, before the first reading, to come forward towards the altar, receive a blessing by the celebrant and dismissed to listen to the Word of God in a language that is appropriate for their comprehension. They process in the center aisle following the lectionary which raised high. Once they have gathered in the Grade 1 room with the catechists, the Liturgy of the Word is proclaimed, a reflection is shared with the children and after the Prayer of the Faithful, they return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The next Children's Liturgy of the Word gathering will be on July 19th. There will be NO Children's Liturgy of the Word on July 5th.
