◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Please contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

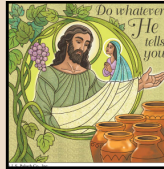

SURPRISES



Life is full of surprises, some pleasant, some not. The scriptures are filled with stories of God's surprises cropping up when they are least expected: younger children obtaining the inheritance; the lowliest being seated highest up; an itinerant preacher, killed like a criminal, exalted to eternal, heavenly glory.

Anybody who has planned a wedding or similar event knows that they are filled with opportunities for surprises. For the bridegroom in today's Gospel story, who has no direct contact with Jesus, the pleasant surprise came because somebody else paid attention and had faith in Jesus. We may think that the point of today's familiar story of the wedding at Cana is that when we have faith in Jesus, our lives will be pleasantly changed. A Christian, however, needs to have a broader perspective and realize that to have faith in Christ means that somebody's life—not necessarily our own—will be surprised for the better. Copyright © J. 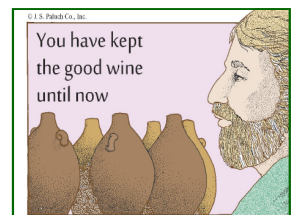

YEAR OF MERCY

In March 2015, Pope Francis announced that on Dec. 8, 2015 we will begin a jubilee year to be called the Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy. A jubilee year is a special year called by the church to receive blessing and pardon from God and remission of sins. The Catholic Church has called jubilee years every 25 or 50 years since the year 1300 and has also called special jubilee years from time to time, known as extraordinary jubilee years. The theme for this Extraordinary Jubilee Year of Mercy is "Be merciful, just as your father is merciful."

There is a tremendous need for mercy in our world today. Pope Francis wants our parishes to become "islands of mercy in a sea of indifference" (message for Lent 2015). He envisions a year when people will become more merciful in their own lives and bring God's mercy to others.



How Will You Celebrate the Jubilee?

- ◆ Contemplate Mercy – by contemplating mercy we begin to see how God gives of himself to us and asks nothing in return.
- ◆ Don't judge or condemn – refraining from judgment and condemnation is an act of mercy, because it allows us to accept the good in every person and spare that person suffering caused by our negative attitudes.
- ◆ Forgive – when we forgive, we release the poison of resentment that builds up inside us. Forgiveness is an act of mercy for ourselves as well as for the person who hurt us.
- ◆ Listen to God's word – to become more merciful we must listen to the Word of God in Scripture and meditate on the message of God's mercy.
- ◆ Go on a Pilgrimage – make a pilgrimage to a Holy Door in Rome or in our archdiocese, where we can receive special graces granted during the jubilee year.
- ◆ Recognize the need for mercy – we are called to find human misery in our world and reach out to those in need of mercy.
- ◆ Practice the Spiritual and Corporal works of Mercy
- ◆ Change our hearts – the ultimate goal of the Year of Mercy is to help us change our hearts and our lives so we can become conduits of God's mercy in everything we say and do.

Questions of the Week:

In the gospel reading, Jesus and his friends are taking part in a wedding celebration at Cana. Everyone is having a grand old time until the wine runs out. Then Jesus, in what is described as the first of his signs (miracles), turns six jars of water into choice wine! Everyone is astonished. But turning the water used for Jewish rituals into wine, Jesus gives God's people a sign that the Messiah has come. At this wedding celebration, Jesus gave the wedding couple and guests the gift of choice wine! He also gave them, and us, the gift of a deeper and fuller knowledge of himself, who he really was. "He revealed his glory, and his disciples believed in him."

What does this say about the importance of celebrations in our lives? Jesus didn't consider a wedding celebration to be "beneath him." He was there, fully present.

What is our attitude toward family celebrations—birthdays, weddings, baptisms, or funerals? How can we be more present to these happy or sad times together? How can we use them as occasions to know one another better and to encourage one another?
