◆ BAPTISM ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class one year prior to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Second Grade.

◆ CONFIRMATION ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class one year prior to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Ninth Grade.

◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Please contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

◆ RELIGIOUS EDUCATION ◆

C.F.F.— Child Faith Formation. Programs nurturing children's growth and forming their baptismal faith from Grade 1 to Grade 12. Classes are on Tuesday afternoons and evenings beginning in September.

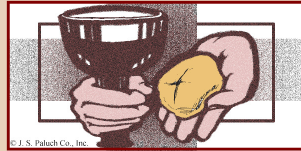
The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

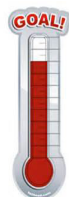


Questions of the Week:

Our gospel story today shows Jesus and the Twelve surrounded by a huge, hungry crowd. When the Twelve protest that they cannot feed everyone, Jesus has them divide the crowd into smaller groups. Then he takes what they have—five loaves, two fishes—gives thanks (blesses the food), breaks it, and invites the disciples to pass it around and share it. There is more than enough for everyone! We can, of course, see this story as a sign of the Eucharist, in which Jesus continues to feed the multitude of his followers. But we can also see it as a challenge to do what we can to feed the millions of hungry people in our world today. This gospel story shows Jesus taking ordinary food and asking that his disciples share it.

How can we share ordinary food with the hungry today?

FIRST FRIDAY at MATER DOLOROSA

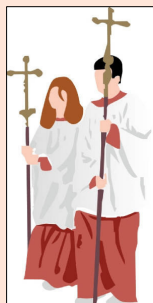

The Mater Dolorosa Altar Server Ministry needs more servers in order to support our scheduled Masses throughout the year. Altar Service is a great way for the children, teens and young adults of our parish to become more engaged in the Mass and in building our faith community.

To become an Altar Server, you only need four things: 1) to be a member of the Parish, 2) to have received your First Holy Communion, 3) in the 4th grade or older, and 4) to have a loving heart to serve the Lord.



We provide the training and schedule our newest servers alongside our veterans so those that are still learning have someone helping them at their first several Masses.

Altar Servers are Jesus' special assistants and other than the priest, the ones closest to the miracle of the Consecration at Mass. Most assuredly, the Lord looks with favor on those who serve! So we hope you will join us as a new member of this joyful ministry.

Why do Catholics believe Christ is in the Precious Blood or the Host?

Once the bread and wine has been consecrated during Mass, Jesus Christ is wholly present under the appearance either of bread or of wine in the Eucharist. In fact, Christ is wholly present in any fragment the Host or in any drop of the Precious Blood. It is possible to receive the whole Christ in just one form or the other.
