Please contact the Rectory Office at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

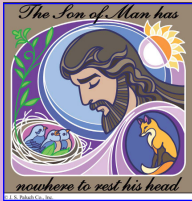

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

An old and still vital treasure in our tradition is a document called the "Apostolic Traditions," giving us a snapshot of church life in third-century Rome. Its author, Hippolytus, describes the liturgical life of the church and records the actual texts of the prayers. The way he explained the various "orders" of the church was the basis for a major reform of the rites of ordination by Pope Pius XII in 1947, and later for the Second Vatican Council. Hippolytus tells us that a bishop had to be elected by the entire people, and that ordination had to take place on a Sunday in the presence of the people, the presbyters, and neighboring bishops. The bishop-candidate is ordained by the other bishops, who impose their hands on his head while everyone else keeps a profound silence, awaiting the outpouring of the Spirit. There is a prayer of blessing said by one of them, on behalf of all, asking for the Spirit and describing his ministry.



Later centuries layered new features on top of this liturgy, including the requirement for three bishop consecrators. Today, whenever a new bishop is announced (election by the people is no more), a kind of genealogy is provided, tracing his pedigree through the consecrating bishops down through the centuries to Peter and the first body of believers. Every bishop today can trace his office through his consecrators back to the beginning in a tradition called "apostolic succession."

Why do Catholics go to Confession?

The Church calls Confession (The Sacrament of Reconciliation) a sacrament of healing. Sin wounds our relationship with God and with each other. Jesus came to save us from sin. So that the forgiveness of sins would continue, Jesus instituted the Sacrament of Reconciliation, saying, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:20).

"Witnesses to Freedom" is the theme of the U.S. bishops' fifth annual Fortnight for Freedom, which opens June 21, the vigil of the feast of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, and closes on Independence Day, July 4. The Fortnight for Freedom is "based on love of country and of liberty," according to the USCCB. The aim is to "encourage Catholics, other Christians and all people of good will to set aside two weeks to reflect on religious freedom," it said. The annual observance also gets to the heart of what Pope Francis said during his visit last September to the United States, the USCCB said, noting the pope "encouraged us to nurture, promote and defend the precious gift of religious freedom."

Children's Liturgy of the Word -

Children's Liturgy of the Word - Every first and third Sunday of the month during the 10:00am Mass, children in grades K to 5 are invited after the opening prayer, before the first reading, to come forward towards the altar, receive a blessing by the celebrant

and dismissed to listen to the Word of God in a language that is appropriate for their comprehension. They gather in the center isle following the lectionary which raised high. Once they have gathered in the Grade 1 room with the catechists, the Liturgy of the Word is proclaimed, a reflection is shared with the children and after the Prayer of the Faithful, they return for the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The next Children's Liturgy of the Word gathering will be on July 17th. (We will not have Children's Liturgy of the Word on July 3rd).
