# CHILD FAITH FORMATION CHILD FAITH FORMATION 2016-17 YEAR IN REVIEW:

- We welcomed 24 new families into our program for school year 2016-17.
- 123 students enrolled; 71% were returning students, 29% were new students
- Our theme for our faith formation year was focused on "Prayer". In our gatherings, we prayed for the intention of the Holy Father, learned about each intention for the month and prayed twice by singing a song expressing how much God loves each one of us. In our homes, we had two Mama Mary's visit with our families for the week. 58 out of 94 families participated in praying the Rosary with Mama Mary some even took her home 3x.
- The Saints (disguised as Confirmation students) visited us and shared the stories of their lives.
- Church time was spent familiarizing ourselves with the parts of the Mass and visiting with our Lord during Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament.
- During Advent we learned about the story of Saint Juan Diego and we collected over 250 pairs of socks and toiletries that were gifted to the St. Vincent de Paul Homeless Help Center on Grand Ave and the Gubbio Project in San Francisco. We also gifted SVDP Homeless Help Center with festive holiday cookies.
- A week before Christmas, the catechists sponsored 2 families from the Samaritan House and gifted them with much deserved presents for Christmas.
- During the Epiphany, we collected over 300 warm jackets for adults and children. These jackets were gifted to the Catholic Worker House in San Bruno, SVDP Homeless Help Center and Samaritan House.
- During Lent were reminded by Cardinal Timothy Dolan that sometimes we get off track and Lent is an opportunity for us to find our way back to God, CFF families and parish gifted the SVDP MD Conference with much needed non-perishable and canned food and donated \$734.00 to the operation CRS Rice Bowl. Our catechists and a few parishioners made 200 lunch bags to distribute to our brothers and sisters at the Gubbio project and we made cookies for St. Patrick's day that were gifted to SVDP Homeless Help Center on Grand Ave.
- Our CFF parents/guardians spent quite time with our Lord during the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament.
- The First Communion and Confirmation 2 families went on retreat.
- We had 32 students receive First Holy Communion and 23 students received the Sacrament of Confirmation.
- We ended the school year with a family Mass and a student recognition evening. We also recognized families who have shown their dedication (4+ years) to ensuring their children are formed in their faith.

What's happening now . . . summer has officially begun. As plans are made to make memories this summer, it is also a great time to reinforce what we learned about prayer. Summer is a great time to expand your family's use of prayer in everyday life. Children of all ages should be very familiar with the basic prayers, The Sign of the Cross, The Lord's Prayer, Hail Mary, and Glory Be. Finding God in all the activities that we do is one way to keep our children and families learning and growing in our faith. Sunday Mass is even more important when classes are out for the summer. Take some time and enjoy other churches around us as you make your summer plans. Get out of your regular "pew" and experience the church from a different perspective.
