◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Please contact the Parish Center at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

Timothy asks that same persistence of his community and us. Luke tells of a court case won by a widow, despite the dishonesty of the judge, because she will not leave him alone. Why do Catholics Use Oil in Sacraments?

In the Bible, dedicating someone to God's service was symbolized by pouring oil on them: priests, prophets, and kings were anointed. It meant that they were set apart by God for an important mission. For the early Church, this anointing also symbolized the outpouring of the Holy Spirit (Acts 10:38). In Confirmation, for example, we are dedicated to God's service and receive an increase of the Spirit's gifts, which are symbolized by the oil (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #1303).

During the month of November, we join Christian churches throughout the

world to pray for all who have passed through death into the eternal embrace of God. The altar de muertos (remembrance altar) is a tradition originating mainly in Mexico, but is observed in a number of other Latin American countries, for día de los muertos (Day of the Dead/All Souls Day). Similar traditions related to the celebration of All Souls Day exist around the world to remember and honor the deceased. Everyone is invited to place a 5X6 photo of a loved one and a short story written on a note card to share. To ensure that priceless photos of your loved ones are not lost or destroyed, it is best to bring a photocopied photo. We will display the photos in the vestibule of the church so that we can remember and pray for them during the month of November. Photos and stories can be dropped off in the CFF office.
