◆ BAPTISM ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class one year prior to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Ninth Grade.

◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Please contact the Parish Center at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

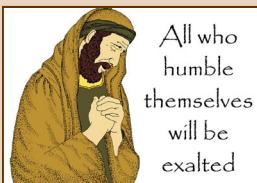

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**Sirach 35:12-14, 16-18; Psalm: 34;
2 Timothy 4:6-8, 16-18; Luke 18:9-14**

RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

Today's readings invite us into prayer, into relationship with God. Because relationships feel more natural when we know one another well, Sirach encourages us to know God better. In his wisdom, Sirach tells us what God is like: fair, open-minded, compassionate, and attentive. "The Lord will not delay," he says. Knowing that God's help comes right on time, whenever we need it, calms our hearts and helps us trust the Lord. In his second Letter to Timothy, Saint Paul demonstrates his own trust in God. Despite the grueling struggles Saint Paul has faced because of his Christian faith, he praises the Lord for rescuing him time and again. Today's Gospel draws us close to Jesus too, revealing his special love for the poor and humble. As Jesus tells his parable about the prayer habits of a Pharisee and a tax collector, our hearts long to become as gentle as Christ's.

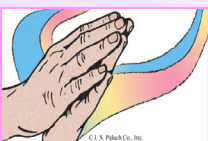


First Reading: The Lord is not deaf to the wail of the orphan, nor to the widow when she pours out her complaint.

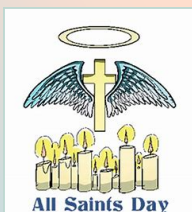

All Saints Day, and is a **Holy Day of Obligation**. Mass times are 8:00 a.m., 12:00 Noon, and 7:30 p.m. Eucharistic Adoration will follow the 8:00 a.m. Mass. The Latin Mass will take place in the Monastery at 12:00 p.m. The Healing Session will take place following the 7:30 p.m. Mass, in the church.



Saturday, November 2nd is **All Soul's Day**. You may fill the names of those you would like remembered on your offering envelopes that you receive monthly as registered parishioners, or you will find extra envelopes in the church vestibule. Please place them in the collection baskets or turn them into the Parish Center and they will be placed on our altar during the month of November. Do not place them on the altar, our staff will do that for you.



"Remembrance Altar" – "Altar de Muertos"

During the month of November, we join Christian churches throughout the world to pray for all who have passed through death into the eternal embrace of God. The altar de muertos (remembrance altar) is a tradition originating mainly in Mexico, but is observed in a number of other Latin American countries, for día de los muertos (Day of the Dead/All Souls Day). Similar traditions related to the celebration of All Souls Day exist around the world to remember and honor the deceased. Everyone is invited to place a 5X6 photo of a loved one and a short story written on a note card to share. To ensure that priceless photos of your loved ones are not lost or destroyed, it is best to bring a photocopied photo. We will display the photos in the vestibule of the church so that we can remember and pray for them during the month of November. Photos and stories can be dropped off in the CFF office.
