◆ BAPTISM ◆

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class one year prior to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Second Grade.

Children must be enrolled in the Faith Formation Class one year prior to the year of preparation for the Sacrament. In most cases, this sacrament is celebrated in Ninth Grade.

◆ MARRIAGE ◆

Please contact the Parish Center at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

Romans 8:14-17; Matthew 28:16-20



THE MYSTERY
OF THE BLESSED TRINITY

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. The Church sets aside this Sunday to focus our attention on the mystery of the Blessed Trinity, God who is one, but three persons—Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The first reading from Deuteronomy emphasizes both God's awesome greatness and amazing nearness. It might seem beyond belief, but the God of all creation speaks to us, protects us, and guides us. The second reading from Saint Paul's Letter to the Romans describes how we are to relate to the three persons who are one God. We are led by the Spirit to meet God the Father as adopted children. Our adoption is such that we are even heirs with our brother, Christ, the second person of the Trinity, in whose sufferings we must also share. In Matthew's Gospel, Jesus speaks with his authority as God and sends us to teach and baptize in the name of the Trinity. Copyright © J. S. Paluch Co.

If you do not celebrate Mass in person, the names of those who have Mass Intentions will be dedicated to those persons.

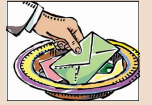
The priest who celebrates the Mass, has the names of the intended, and keeps them in his prayers.

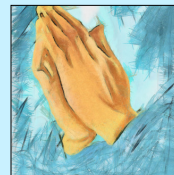

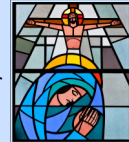

As the Bay Area moves back to normalcy, we encourage you to participate again in our in-church masses. Masks are a requirement for entry. Your parish misses you and so do your fellow parishioners.

The parish team together with Fr. Roland have taken precautionary steps since the start of the pandemic and will continue to practice the following:

- 1) Contact tracing - we request that you fill in the contact form after your temperature has been taken by the parish volunteers.
- 2) Sanitizers - spread around the church are sanitizers for your purpose. Feel free to use them.
- 3) Social distancing - occupancy will be on every other pew only. Those bunched together are in the same social bubble either as family or those living in the same roof. We will open the parish hall with chairs six feet apart on an as needed basis.
- 4) Holy Communion - distribution is at the two opposite aisles to create social distancing. Those on the left aisle exit through the front door nearest to the altar, and those on the right exit through the main aisle and towards the main entrance.
- 5) Sanitizing after Mass - currently, we have a handful of volunteers from the Usher Ministry who help sanitize the pews, the altar, and common public areas after each and every Mass.
- 6) HEPA filters - the church purchased some industrial type HEPA filters last year to help with air filtration and safety.
- 7) Please wear your MASK to Mass.

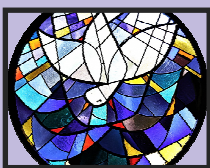

FEAST OF FAITH

Liturgy and the Holy Trinity

The Trinity is the central mystery of our faith. We believe that God is one, yet three: total unity and rich diversity. God is not a monolith, but a dynamic community of persons, a perfect, loving harmony of three. And the liturgy is the work of the Trinity. We begin all our liturgical celebrations with the sign of the cross, a reminder of our Trinitarian baptism, and the simplest of all professions of our faith. We believe that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, and we gather in the name of this triune God. Throughout the Mass, we address our prayers to God the Father, through Christ our Lord, in the Spirit's power. And the Father hears our prayer, transforming bread and wine into the Body and Blood of his Son by the Holy Spirit. The Church is "the sacrament of trinitarian communion" (Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). It is the Trinity who holds us together as well. In the words of Saint Cyprian, we are "a people made one by the unity of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit" (quoted in Sacramentum Caritatis, 16). —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J. S.
