Please contact the Parish Center at least 6 months prior to your wedding date to allow time for Marriage Preparation.

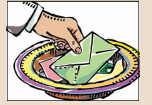

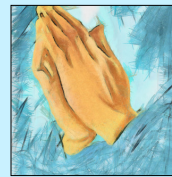

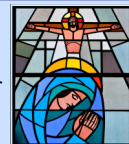

Mass Schedule and Guidelines at Mater Dolorosa Church



As the Bay Area moves back to normalcy, we encourage you to participate again in our in-church masses. Masks are a requirement for entry. Your parish misses you and so do your fellow parishioners.

The parish team together with Fr. Roland have taken precautionary steps since the start of the pandemic and will continue to practice the following:

- 1) Contact tracing - we request that you fill in the contact form after your temperature has been taken by the parish volunteers.
- 2) Sanitizers - spread around the church are sanitizers for your purpose. Feel free to use them.
- 3) Social distancing - occupancy will be on every other pew only. Those bunched together are in the same social bubble either as family or those living in the same roof. We will open the parish hall with chairs six feet apart on an as needed basis.
- 4) Holy Communion - distribution is at the two opposite aisles to create social distancing. Those on the left aisle exit through the front door nearest to the altar, and those on the right exit through the main aisle and towards the main entrance.
- 5) Sanitizing after Mass - currently, we have a handful of volunteers from the Usher Ministry who help sanitize the pews, the altar, and common public areas after each and every Mass.
- 6) HEPA filters - the church purchased some industrial type HEPA filters last year to help with air filtration and safety.
- 7) Please wear your MASK to Mass.

FEAST OF FAITH - *The Collection: A Privilege*

As the altar is prepared for the celebration of the Eucharist, the collection is taken up. In the early church, this part of the Mass must have been something to behold, as the people suddenly began to move, bringing forward to the deacons and priests freshly-baked bread and fine wine. Then, after the Eucharistic Prayer, that same community came forward again in the Communion procession, and they received back the very gifts they had given, now transformed into something infinitely more precious than bread and wine: the very Body and Blood of Christ. Beginning around the eleventh century, it became the custom for people to present money instead of bread and wine, and the procession of the faithful gradually disappeared (it survives in the liturgy of Holy Thursday). But the meaning is the same. We continue to bring the fruit of our labors and to offer them freely to God. And God continues to transform them into Christ. It is through our generous sharing of time, talent, and treasure that our parishes can preach the gospel, reach out to the sick and the imprisoned, and celebrate the sacraments. —Corinna Laughlin, Copyright © J.
